All of us together — diverse employees, partners, volunteers and Tribes — conserving California's forests and grasslands.






Add the challenge of climate change — severe droughts, massive rain events, and wildfires now happening every few years.

And so began the era of full fire suppression — requiring all fires be extinguished within 24 hours.








From 1940s to World War II, timber became critical for war effort. So, figures like Smokey Bear reminded public about danger of forest fires.
